

One Earth Writing invites teens to apply for its 2017-2018 Ambassador Program

One Earth Writing will be accepting applications for its 2017-18 Ambassador Program.

One Earth Writing Ambassadors are teenagers interested in exploring their writing talent through a lens of identity. They are open-minded youth with a desire to lead, who will participate in regular writing workshops led by Lynne Golodner, One Earth Writing founder and CEO of the nonprofit that connects teens across racial, religious and socioeconomic divides through writing.

“As someone who loves literature and connecting with other cultures, the One Earth Writing Ambassadors program has been like no other,” said Ashleigh Garrison, a Detroit resident and 2017 graduate of International Academy East, who was part of the first OEW class of Ambassadors.

“I would recommend this program to anyone who is passionate about writing and willing to open themselves up to others’ mindsets, cultures and more. Whether you’ve been writing since adolescence or it’s something you are just getting into, apply. No matter your experience level, you’ll gain a lot of knowledge from the program. If you’re looking for a safe, judge-free environment (with great food, too), then this is the program for you.”

A maximum of 15 students will be accepted to each of the two classes, at no cost to teens. Ambassador graduates receive a certificate of completion that counts toward six hours of community service. They are then invited to apply

to become Senior Ambassadors, continuing with peers in writing workshops and assuming advanced leadership roles in planning and leading programs for their peers in the community.

“It is our goal at One Earth Writing to use story as a way of expanding world views, working with youth to change a generation’s perspective, so that one day, we may live in a world where we see similarity rather than difference,” said Golodner.
